Lesson Plans

Pronouns

Objective:

Students will be able to define pronouns and identify them in sentences.

Materials:

- Whiteboard and markers
- Worksheet

Introduction:

- 1. Start by explaining that a pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun in a sentence.
- 2. Give examples of common pronouns such as he, she, they, it.

Activity:

- 1. Display a simple sentence on the whiteboard:
 - "Mary is going to the store. She needs groceries."
- 2. Ask students to identify the pronoun in the second sentence (she) and explain what noun it replaces. The noun is Mary.
- 3. Encourage students to complete activity sheets.
- 4. Form small groups and give each group index cards with pronouns; they must create a sentence using the pronouns.
- 5. Hand out the worksheet with sentences and ask students to underline or hi-light the pronouns in each sentence.

Assessment:

- 1. Ask students to complete assignment.
- 2. Ask students to write three sentences of their own using pronouns to replace nouns.

Conclusion:

- 1. Review the concept of pronouns and answer any questions.
- 2. Reinforce the importance of pronouns in avoiding repetition and making sentences more concise.
- 3. Encourage students to practice using pronouns in their writing and speech.
